

Bandai Azuma Skyline

The Bandai Azuma Skyline is a 29 km alpine road with a maximum elevation of 1622 m that winds through the Azuma Mountains west of Fukushima City. This scenic route is known as “the road that runs across the sky” and offers impressive panoramic views of Fukushima City and the surrounding areas. You can experience snow-lined corridors in early spring, a fiery display of multi-colored autumn leaves, hiking through sub-alpine forests, and an other-worldly volcanic landscape. The Bandai Azuma skyline captivates travelers from near and far with its breathtaking array of scenery. Azuma Sport Park

Located alongside the Arakawa River in the foothills of the Azuma mountain range, this vast park covers over 100 hectares of land. You can enjoy the beauty of the four seasons surrounded by the area’s natural scenery, such as the cherry blossoms in spring, golden-rayed lilies in summer, and ginkgo trees in the autumn. There are event centres such as a baseball stadium, gymnasium and athletic track, capable of hosting events in many sports.

Goshikinuma Ponds

Goshikinuma Ponds has a 1-star rating in the Michelin Green Guide of 2016. The Goshikinuma Pond group is a generic term for numerous lakes and ponds which include Bishamonnuma, Akanuma, Midoronuma, Tatsunuma, Bentennuma, Rurinum, Aonuma and Yanaginuma. It is said that the “mysterious lake” is a mysterious place where the colours of emerald green, cobalt blue, turquoise blue, emerald blue, and pastel blue differ depending on the swamp Aonuma in particular has such a beautiful colour that it cannot be thought of as something created by nature. The name, Goshikinuma, as written in Japanese (Goshikinuma or five color ponds), is rather a misnomer. The area consists of many more than five ponds. And is also famous for displaying a much larger spectrum of spectacular colours. Factors such as weather, season, angle of view, volcanic substances contained in the water, etc. can affect the colours that you see. For this reason, we recommend that you visit again at different times of the year.

Matsumoto Castles is one of five castles designated as ‘National Treasures of Japan’ and the oldest five-tiered, six-story castle tower remaining in Japan. Construction began in 1592 of the elegant black and white structure with its three turrets. Inside the castle are steep stairs and low ceilings leading past displays of armor and weapons from the Sengoku Period (Warring State Period) when the castle was built. The narrow wooden windows, once used by archers and gunmen, provide amazing views of the Japanese Alps, Matsumoto City and the koi and swans circling in the moat below.



Shingu Kumano Shrine

A magnificent building with 44 thick pillars and no walls or doors around it. “Nagadoko”, an important cultural property of Japan, is a Shinden-zukuri building built in the latter half of the Heian period as a chapel of Kumano Shrine. The 800-year-old Shintai and the large ginkgo trees in the precincts are wonderful every season.

Matsushima

Along with Amanohashidate in Kyoto and Miyajima in Hiroshima, Matsushima Bay is known as one of Japan's top three scenic views. The bay is dotted with some 260 islands of various sizes. The best locations for a panoramic view of these islands are known as the Shitaikan and each location has a nickname describing its view. The Sokan (magnificent) from Mount at 116.8m above sea level is the highest viewpoint of the Shitaikan. Visitors can enjoy a graceful view of Matsushima Bay from the peaceful garden of Daigoji Temple enshrining Tomiyama Kannon at the top of the mountain. The Yukan (spiritual view) from Ogidani highland at 55.8m above sea level provides a panoramic view of Matsushima Bay and the beautiful fan shaped inlet spanning to the bay before you. The Yukan is also known for its stunning display of autumn leaves. After enjoying the magnificent view from the Shitaikan, a pleasure boat ride through the islands is another popular attraction. Feeding the flock of seagulls from the boat will be one of the many local memories that will remain with you!



Perched on a small island jutting out into Matsushima Bay with a vermilion lacquered bridge connecting it to the mainland, Godaido Temple is the traditional symbol of Matsushima and a scenic location from from which to view the bay. The small temple was originally founded as Bishamondo by the famous general Tamuramaro Sakanoue in 807 and took its name Godaido when the priest Ennin installed images of the Five wisdom Kings in 828. The temple opens its doors to the public for the viewing of these images only once every 33 years.

Zuiganji is the family temple of Masamune Date, a famous feudal lord of the Age of Civil Wars of the 15th and 16th centuries. The temple was originally founded in 828. After deterioration through the civil war period it was restored by Masamune Date and his aesthetic styling can be seen throughout the buildings. The main hall and Kuri (the Zen kitchen) are designated national treasures. Inside the main hall the brilliant paintings on the sliding doors are must see. The graceful Ume (Japanese plum) blossoms surrounding the main hall are exhilarating in spring. Visitors can also see Masamune's aesthetics in the arabesque-pattern engravings in the Kuri.



Kanrantei is a tearoom built on a small hill on the Matsushima Coast to allow you to appreciate the ripples on the water. It is said that the tearoom of Hideyoshi Toyotomi, which was once located in Fushimi Momoyama Castle, was received by Date Masamune and relocated to his Edo domain residence. It was then relocated without changing one piece of timber or stone to this area where it is possible to enjoy a superb view of Matsushima Bay by the second domain leader of Tadamune. The splendid and formal building that has been used for sightseeing and lodging by important persons has been designated as an important cultural property of Japan.
